Figure 1: Paediatric beds occupied in STPN DGHs

The data is now showing a steady decline in the number of occupied beds across the region and number of children with LRTIs.

There was a similar pattern of reduced admissions in the PICU units which are not included this week. The 2021 national PICU audit (PICANET) report was published this week. This report is available at here.





Figure 2: South Thames Retrieval Service (STRS) calls & transfers

There has been a decrease in the number of calls and retrievals over the past couple of weeks, with a total of 25 calls and 13 retrievals this week. Two of the transfers were for PIMS-TS and three for LRTIs.

The second week of the New Year brings good news with a reduction in the overall number of COVID-19 cases. However the positive rates have continued to rise in the school age children (5-9 years and 10-19 years) which may lead to ongoing PIMS-TS presentations for the next 6-8 weeks.





Figure 4: Weekly positive reports for all respiratory viruses

Even more encouraging is the downward trend in all the respiratory viruses including RSV, Rhinovirus and Human Metapneumovirus.

SE Regional PIMS-TS MDT

This multidisciplinary virtual meeting, hosted by Evelina London, runs daily at 11am (including weekends). This is a **consultant led** meeting comprising consultants from cardiology, rheumatology, general paediatrics, infectious diseases and intensive care / STRS. With the increasing numbers of patients to discuss it is important we make these meetings as efficient as possible, with this in mind please follow the instructions below to help ensure that the allocated time is used to discuss management rather than relay results:

- 1. All referrals require an updated form, including blood results, prior to the start of the meeting. The forms can be found here.
- 2. The completed form should be emailed to gst-tr.echpims.ts@nhs.net by 10:30 where possible.
- 3. Please add the presenters name and NHS trust, this helps us ensure that the meeting can be efficient and well organised.
- 4. The person presenting the patient must have seen the patient and if below consultant level must have the support of their consultant at the meeting where possible.

Details of the meeting login and time to join will be forwarded by email after submission of the referral form.

Covid treatment: CMDU support

The Paediatric Infectious Disease teams at St Georges and Evelina London are able to provide remote advice/support for local CMDU teams regarding treatment for at risk 12-18 year old patients. This is only to support the decision making process; local services will still be expected to prescribe and administer the therapy in keeping with national and RCPCH guidance.

The UKHSA have published updated UK IPC Guidance:to align with revised guidance recommending that the isolation period for COVID-19 cases and contacts for patients in healthcare settings will reduce from 14 days to 10 days where clinically appropriate.
