## **STPN Dashboard and Data**




## Figure 1: Paediatric beds occupied from 1 January 2022

There has been a steady level for 150-221 beds occupied throughout January and February. The peak proportion of beds occupied by children with lower respiratory tract infections was 13%.




# Figure 2: Paediatric Critical Care (PICU) beds occupied in STPN since 1 January 2022

There number of occupied PICU beds in the South Thames region increased to a maximum of 42 on the 2<sup>nd</sup> of February. The staffed occupancy rates have generally averaged between 80-100%.



## Figure 3: South Thames Retrieval Service (STRS) calls

There was an increased number of calls to STRS during the last week of January and first week of February (2-14 per day), with a maximum of 6 transfers on the 25th January and 1st of February.

## **Paediatric Digital Skills Passports**

The LTLC paediatric digital skills passports are endorsed by the Paediatric Critical Care Society (PCCS) and have been developed:

- To support staff to understand, document and acquire new skills to support the safe delivery of critical care (levels 1, 2 and 3) to children in a surge model of care
- For managerial staff over seeing these surge model roles to have visibility of their team members' skillsets and capability

Resources from the Respiratory Surge in Children programme have been mapped to the passports' skill domain to support self-directed learning.

The paediatric digital skills passport can be accessed via mobile, tablet and desktop and has been created for:

- · Adult critical care nurse caring for children (under 12 years old)
- Adult critical care nurse caring for adolescents (over 12 years old)
- · Stabilisation of children (under 12 years old)
- Registered children's nurse without recent experience and/or formal training in paediatric critical care (PCC)
