Staff Update

We have recently appointed two new Paediatric Critical Care (PCC) Network Clinical Leads: Dr Jatinder Jheeta and Dr Nick Prince. We would like to take this opportunity to thank Dr Sachin Patil and Prof Akash Deep for their contribution to the PCC network.

Dr Jatinder Jheeta is a Consultant Paediatrician at Darent Valley Hospital who has worked in paediatric and neonatal critical care, retrieval and general paediatric services across the South Thames Network. He has been appointed as Clinical Lead for Paediatric Critical Care Levels 1 and 2. Jatinder says 'I hope to collaborate with colleagues from the full multidisciplinary team, to collectively share experiences, learnings and innovative practices, particularly whilst the pressures on our services continue to rise, with higher numbers of sick and more complex children presenting at our doors requiring our service. Figure 1: General Paediatric Beds occupied (01/01/2022 - 17/04/2023)




Figure 1: The start of April has seen a reduction in overall beds occupied to under 200 per day across the network compared to the peak of 300 in December, along with significantly lower levels of children with Bronchiolitis being admitted.

Figure 2: Paediatric Critical Care beds occupied (01/01/2022 - 17/04/2023)




Figure 2: There is a corresponding reduction of PICU bed occupancy since the start of April to under 40 per day across the 3 PICUs, with low levels of children being admitted with Bronchiolitis.


