Neuroscience ODN: Epilepsy

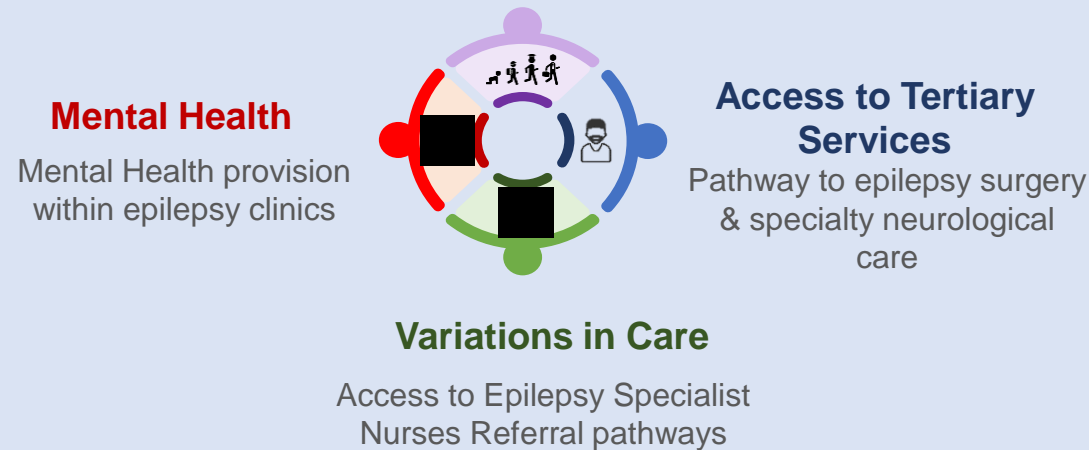
Progress (Started January 2022)

- Introductory discussions and meetings with Clinical Leads for the South East, South West Thames Paediatric Epilepsy Groups
- Linked into Pan London working group
- Identifying other regional links with providers and commissioners involved with Paediatric Epilepsy care
- Identification of areas for development linked to the four national recommendations for Networks
- Good engagement and enthusiasm from clinical teams

Gastroenterology ODN

Key achievements

Established the **Gastroenterology Pathways Task & Finish Group** to review current gastroenterology pathways. To ensure they are based on geography and patients clinical needs.



Development of the constipation **regional referral criteria for GP's**. This will empower GP's to ensure children are getting the correct treatment as early as possible at the right place.



Patient participation : As part of the constipation pathways we have collected **Quality of Life (QoL) data for constipation patients** with 115+ surveys completed.



Key challenges

ENGAGEMENT

Securing consistent **engagement** from our working group and task and finish group clinicians. As well as engagement from patients and families.



RELATIONSHIP BUILDING

Building **relationships with the Primary Sector** particularly GPs and ICSs.

IMPLEMENTING CHANGE

The **challenges** of implementing new referral pathways and supporting the new model of care alongside the financial challenges.

Goals 2022/2023

Implementation of the new pathways for Gastroenterology in 2022.

Identify **outcome measures** for Gastroenterology across the network to ensure we can monitor progress and identify gaps in service provision.



Education and training to support and develop a sustainable workforce



Data collection, analysis and reporting to inform the care of patients with constipation and other gastroenterology conditions. Including review of the STPN QoL data.



Strengthening relationships between primary and secondary care by implementing & piloting the referral criteria for GP's in East Sussex region.

Long Term Ventilation (LTV)

Key achievements

Consolidated 2019-2022 work presented to Integrated Care Systems highlighting areas that require local input e.g. continuing care. Potential pilot projects identified.



Pan London development of 4 expert consensus guides to support provision of the right LTV care, at the right time, in the right place.

Agreement from STPN Tertiary Centres on centralising procurement for ventilators to achieve better value for money and provide equitable servicing support to families.



Secured Health Education England funding to support 2022/23 LTV education & training across the Network and in collaboration with North Thames, Thames Valley & Wessex & East of England ODNs.



Key challenges

FRAGMENTATION

The lack of a national LTV diagnostic code and a regional database for both tracheostomy and Non Invasive Ventilation patients makes it difficult to access reliable data. This limits analysis required to understand the reasons for delays in discharge and to inform the development of the Level 2 model of care to support LTV patients across the network for example.

OUT OF SCOPE

Scoping has identified multiple areas for improvement in the LTV pathway. Not all areas can be addressed by the STPN so decisions need to be made re what is in/out of scope.

DATA

The LTV patient pathway spans from home to tertiary care, and can be very fragmented. There is need to agree ownership and responsibility for various aspects of care e.g. Continuing Health Care, links to Social Care, housing provision to improve patient and family experience.

Oncology ODN: Children's Shared Care

Key Achievements (Started January 2022)

Identifying a **collaborative and supportive role** for the STPN with the newly established South Thames Children's, Teenager's and Young Adult's **Cancer Operational Delivery Network** (STCTYACODN)



Development of a **good working relationship** with the STCTYACODN manager to **identify shared and joint working opportunities**



Linking up the work on transition between the two networks



Development of a **combined Memorandum of Understanding** for both networks for the regional providers



Key challenges

Using baseline survey of current POSCU practice **data** to inform the regional PCC **Level 2 bed model of care**



Effect of the current **uncertainty** of future PTC site on **planning and service development**



Goals 2022/2023



Identifying **further links** for **collaboration and socialising** the new ODN



Agreeing key areas for collaboration across the networks e.g. education & training, data sharing, analysis and reporting



Continued scoping to **identify priority work** especially related to regional PCC Level 2 model of care

Surgery in Children (SIC) ODN

Key achievements

Established 3 new multidisciplinary working groups (ENT, Orthopaedics and Leaders in Training) in addition to the General Surgery and Urology



Developed 3 experts' consensus guides to support provision of the right surgical care, at the right time, in the right place:

- Inter-Hospital transfers for acutely unwell paediatric surgical patients
- Adenotonsillectomy
- Bone & Joint Infections



Secured Health Education England funding to support 2022/2023 surgery in children education and training across the network's Trusts.



3 Network wide audits completed identifying key areas for improvement:

- Appendicetomy and Testicular torsion
- Forearm fractures
- Adenotonsillectomy

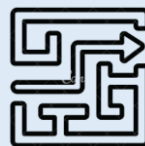

Key challenges

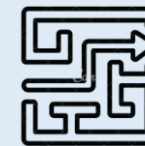
ELECTIVE RECOVERY

The lack of a national system to capture paediatric surgical activity and challenges in NHS priorities has limited the network's ability to support individual Trusts with recovery.



ENGAGEMENT

COVID-19 pandemic has impacted the ability of colleagues to participate in the network's pathways improvement work.



UNCERTAINTY

Emergence of Integrated Care Systems and changes in funding will challenge the need to develop new ways of thinking and working.

Goals 2022/23



Understand **health inequalities** in paediatric surgical care and waiting lists. Provide oversight to the elective recovery process to ensure equity of access.



Support implementation of the STPN agreed Getting It Right First Time (GIRFT) recommendations across the Network



Inform the **model of care for SIC across the region** in response to national reviews and regional needs



Pathway documents created in 2021/2022: implemented & evaluated



Identify themes from patients and families' experience of interacting with paediatric surgical services across the Network



Upskill and develop a sustainable **workforce**



Identify, measure & improve key clinical outcomes for each surgical specialty

STPN Data Collection & Analysis

Key achievements

- Ability for all providers across the region to input daily PICU and normal care ward data into a regional dashboard
- Ability to change data fields to meet operational need e.g. no. of patients with lower respiratory tract infections during winter surge; PICU reporting workforce and acuity
- Increased compliance and data collection has led to comprehensive data analysis and reporting e.g. weekly reported demand and capacity graphs circulated across the network
- Automated daily demand and capacity data sharing and reporting in collaboration with both the London and South East regions and nationally



Key challenges

Ensuring ongoing daily completion by some providers



Trust IT capability to support required access and reporting to and from regional and national platforms

Despite the move towards delivery networks, the NHS is not currently configured for cross-provider information sharing

Cost of hosting the Beautiful Information data collection platform for regional use



Next steps

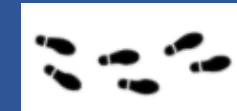
Continued functionality improvement e.g. automated reporting, collecting audit data



Ongoing consultation with network providers to support evolving operational requirements

Development of a shared hosting solution for the STPN and other Evelina hosted networks, with appropriate IT support

Advocate for a network-centric approach to IT and IG platforms and policy in the wider NHS



Diversify funding of the data collection platform and explore lower cost alternatives

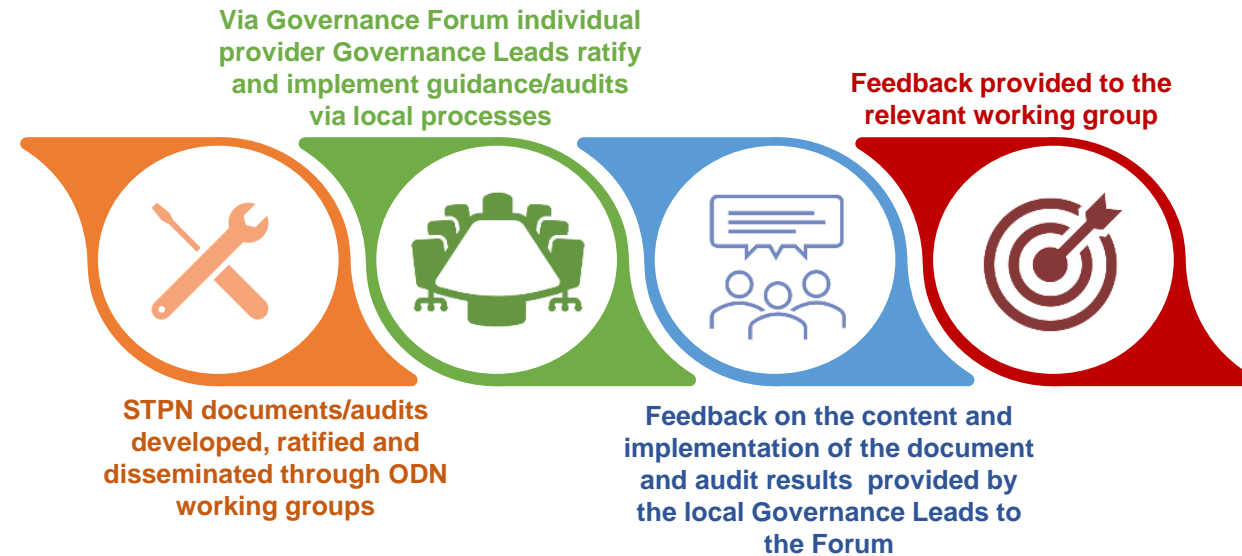
Goals for 2022/23



- ☐ Critical care education for members of the Medical teams

Progress

- Governance Forum established between STPN and all provider Governance Leads, meeting quarterly from November 2021.
- Forum enables oversight of the implementation of STPN guidelines/ policies/ frameworks/audits at all local levels together with a formal feedback process
- Forum provides the ability to highlight and discuss risk that is relevant to the network as a whole e.g. Child Death Review outcomes



Key achievements

- Governance process agreed with providers
- Multiple Guidelines disseminated to local teams have been positively received with implementation in progress
- Monitoring by STPN of engagement from local providers with the ODN work streams which demonstrates input from all providers across the Network

Key Challenges

- Consistent engagement and attendance from all providers
- Obtaining feedback on documents that is substantial enough to set precedents for guidelines/ policies/ frameworks to be amended where needed
- Developing a robust process to review risk
